



INTRODUCTION

Guelph is among the first cities to conduct a Great Tree Hunt. Help was obtained from Samm MacKay of the Kitchener-Waterloo Field Naturalists who organized a tree hunt in the Waterloo Region in 1990. Clara Marett, a councillor, raised this topic at a meeting of Guelph City Council and the Guelph Field Naturalists were invited to take the lead.

THE GREAT TREE HUNT

The Guelph Great Tree Hunt was launched by OPIRG on 2nd June 1991 during Guelph's Environment Week activities. The Guelph Field Naturalists invited the people of the city to nominate the largest or most interesting trees in and around their properties and haunts. There are about 200 species known to occur in the region.

The hunt closed on 31 August 1991. Members of the measuring teams, one for each Ward, checked the identity of each tree and measured the circumference and height. All teams reported that owners, nominators and general public expressed a deep affection for their magnificent trees. Cases were cited where care had been taken during construction to preserve and protect trees and their roots from injury.

The staff of the Recreation and Parks Department, Members of the Arboretum, University of Guelph and the Guelph Field Naturalists were particularly active in encouraging public participation in the program. Unfortunately many trees were missed and the committee received requests to extend the hunt to 1992. It is the aim of both the City and the Naturalists to continue this hunt as requested.

CHOOSING THE WINNERS

In order to calculate the winners for each species and the overall winner a formula, used by the Waterloo Regional Tree Hunt, was used. This involved multiplying the diameter (in centimeters) by one tenth of the height (in meters). The trees with the highest points became the winners for each species and the tree with the greatest point total became the grand champion.

WINNERS

The Grand Champion was a SILVER MAPLE with 468 points. This was in Marksam Park and belonged to the Recreation and Parks Department who declined the prize. Therefore the runner up was a BLACK WILLOW with 413 points, nominated by P. Pentney, who was awarded the Grand Prize. The prize was a copy of The Peterson Field Guide to Trees and Shrubs of Eastern North America donated by the Guelph Field Naturalists. Winners of each species were awarded a copy of 'Natural Heritage Areas of the Guelph Region' also donated by the Guelph Field Naturalists. The owners of these magnificent trees received a certificate of honour from the Mayor of Guelph, John Counsell.
